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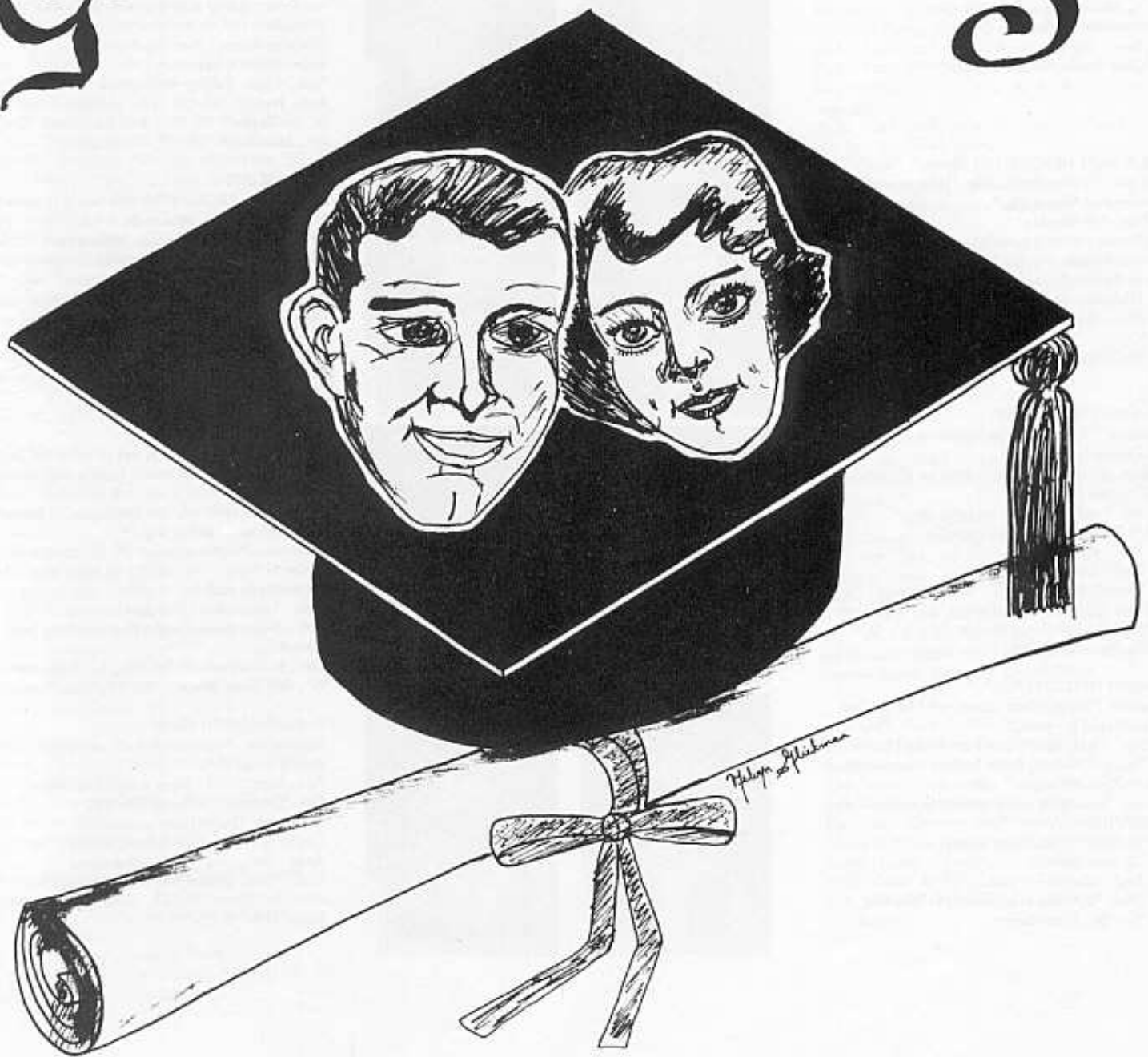

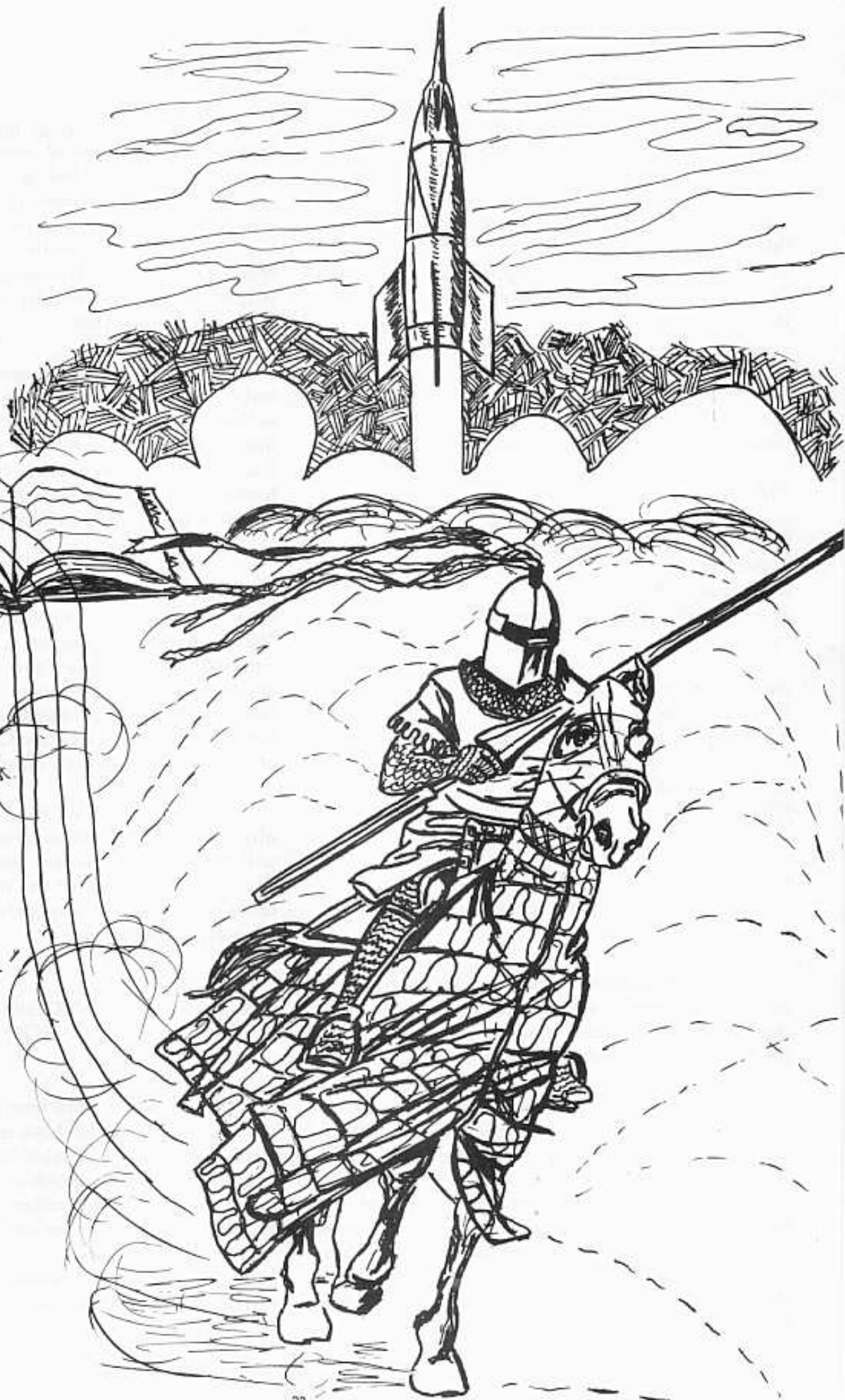

The advertiser quotes reams of irrelevant, unnecessary and absurd facts and statistics and makes ridiculous comparisons which do not prove anything conclusive, but absolutely overwhelm the buyer into buying the product.

them."

Yes, the unscrupulous advertising methods used in television exist in many variegated categories, and are aimed at practically everyone. Surely this is the deepest depth that modern advertising can reach!

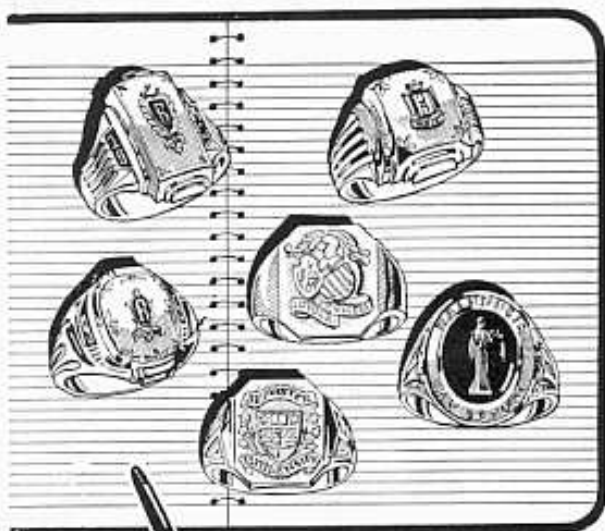
Poor Richard's Almanack

The Council put on a variety of dances during the year. The Football, Coronation, and the Formal Spring Dances were a few of the many--of which the proceeds went to the Council's projects.

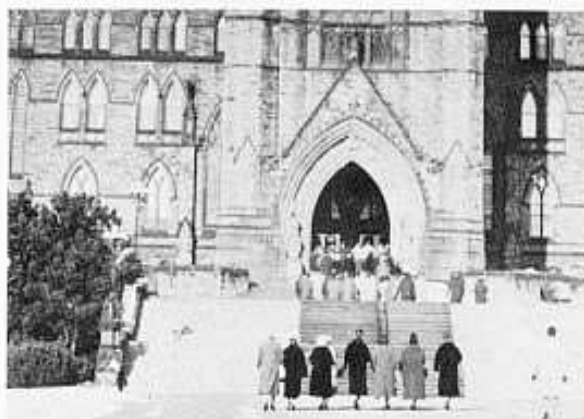
The Council gave two scholarships to the senior students, and also supplied prizes for leadership in individual subjects.

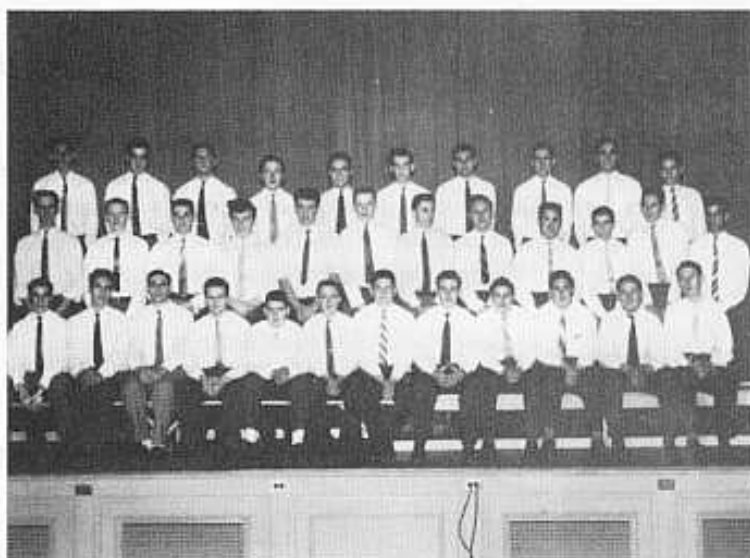

CAMERA CLUB

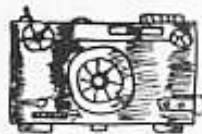
This year marks the fourth season of Monklands' Camera Club. The Student Council provided money to equip a new dark room.

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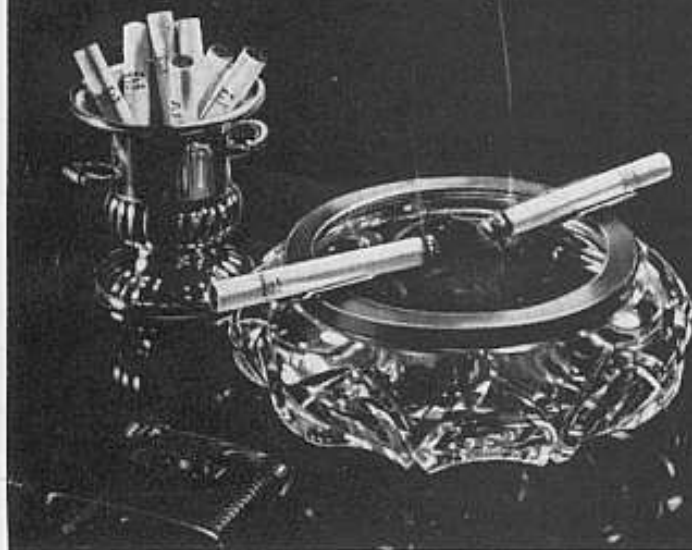
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
