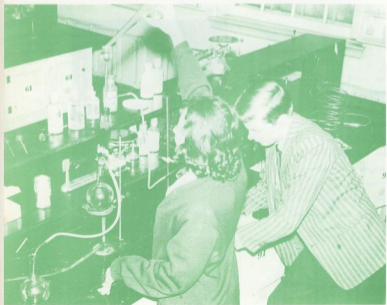
MISS M. PREW

ACADEMICS

From the time a pupil enrolls at Montklands High, he is confronted with an extremely varied selection of subjects. This enables him to choose those courses in which he feels he will excel, and which interest him the most.

In his eighth year, the pupil has a basic choice between a Latin or a Science course. Those who have graduated from elementary school with high scholastic standing are placed in a Latin-Science course; one which is obviously more difficult, but which presents a greater challenge to the above-average student. There are further decisions to be made, such as the choice between an instrumental or a theoretical music course.

The course and subjects begun the previous year are continued in grade nine. This year, however, the elementary knowledge obtained in the mathematics I and II of Grade Eight develop into the study of algebra and geometry. There is a minimum of eleven subjects which include: history, literature, grammar, health, music, geography, French, algebra, spelling, geometry and either Latin, science, or both. Throughout the four years of high school, there is, of course, compulsory physical education.

The tenth year is a difficult one. The student is taking an important step in determining his future. There is a choice of five courses, and these must be chosen with a good deal of thought and consideration. The five courses are Engineering, Latin, Science I, Science II, and Commercial. All except commercial, include literature and composition, history, French: oral and written, either biology or physics, and chemistry or geography. The engineering students learn trigonometry and intermediate algebra, the Latin students study Latin Prose and Poetry. Science I includes a trigonometry course while Science II pupils choose between art, music or technical drawing. The Commercial course consists basically of typing, book-keeping and shorthand.

Eleventh year is merely a continuation of the tenth grade. However, as can be expected, it is a great deal more difficult, and the student must, at all times, keep in mind the fact that his year closes with matriculation exams. These exams will more or less determine his future.

As well as the ordinary selection of courses, several experimental or advanced courses have recently been instituted into the curriculum. These are P.S.C.C. Physics (Physical Science Study Committee), a "Course Two" French placing greater emphasis on conversation and speeches, with less time spent on grammar, and an advanced mathematics course in the top grade eight class.

This variety of subjects at Montklands High should continue to produce well-rounded students as it has always done in the past.

COURSE II FRENCH

For many years, a student in Grade eleven took a French course consisting basically of grammar and novels. Recently, however, a new French course has been made available to the more ambitious students. Course II French places emphasis on conversation, and the daily lessons are largely conducted in French. Each week the student is required to write a speech approximately five minutes in length. The subjects vary from "Mon Ecole" to "L'organisation des Nations Unies" and require a great deal of effort. As well, several novels are studied during the term. Pupils who have taken Course II French, very often take a greater interest in the language itself, and may continue to study French in university.

P.S.C. PHYSICS

For the past few years a new physics course has been instituted into the curriculum of some grade ten and eleven classes. This course called P.S.S.C. Physics (Physical Science Study Committee) introduces the concept of instruments being extensions of our own senses. Separated into various divisions, the course includes first of all Kinematics, a study of how an object moves under given conditions. Kinematics is extended to Dynamics the study of why an object moves, and from there, the student studies light properties, electricity and magnetism. The course is a more difficult one but it does have a more logical approach to the subject.

MATHEMATICS

As part of new experimental programs in the school, the top grade eight class made use of a new Mathematics text recently introduced in Ontario. The course differs from the traditional in that the concept of abstract structures has been given prominence. It will probably be continued with the same group of students next year.

A more modern trigonometry text introduced experimentally in the entire province of Quebec is now in use in the grade ten classes of Montklands High. The book uses an analytical approach to the subject which is more in keeping with the modern use of trigonometry.

MUSIC

Man has hidden in the recesses of his brain, an explosive quality called talent. If cultivated with care, it will bloom as a garden of rare and beautiful fruits. Sadly enough, many gifted people let weeds consume the bud before its time. Talent has a variety of servants through which she expresses herself. One of the greatest of these is music. Music is a poetry of emotions capable of subduing the lion and enraging the lamb.

Each of the great musicians expressed his soul in a different manner. Force, violence, and strength were the expressions of Beethoven, himself a violent, passionate man. Music is the giving of your soul to the world, exposing your thoughts and moods, losing yourself and replacing your soul with poetry of sound. Music is not confined to instrumental sounds alone. It manifests itself in nature also. Music is the song of a bird, the rustle of the crisp leaves herded by an autumn wind, the sound of the ocean as it rolls and clings to the shore, the beat of a heart reviving under the skilled hands of a physician. Music is the laughter of a young girl, the whisper of a breeze through a field of maturing wheat. All the sounds we hear can be music if our heart is light, for music is beauty.

Music can be a bond between brother and brother for no matter what tongue is spoken, music itself is universal. The voyageurs of long ago sang hearty, warm, French-Canadian songs to lighten the day's work. In churches and synagogues music is used as a common bond of praise. Music compels the feet to dance, the hands to clap, the voice to sing. Music stirs the heart to appreciate the qualities of talent. It moves and swells the soul until it seems to burst. Music can crush the soul as well as put it in ecstasy. Music, then, knows no bonds of time, no tongue, no race. Music is one of the greatest talents God has given men.

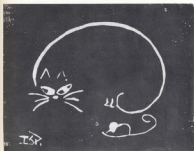

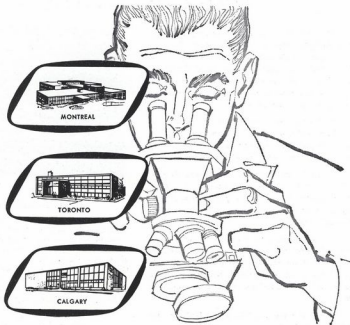


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ORGANIZATIONS

CAREER QUIZ

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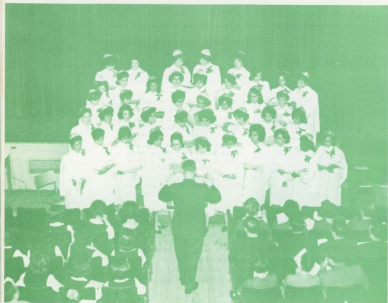
