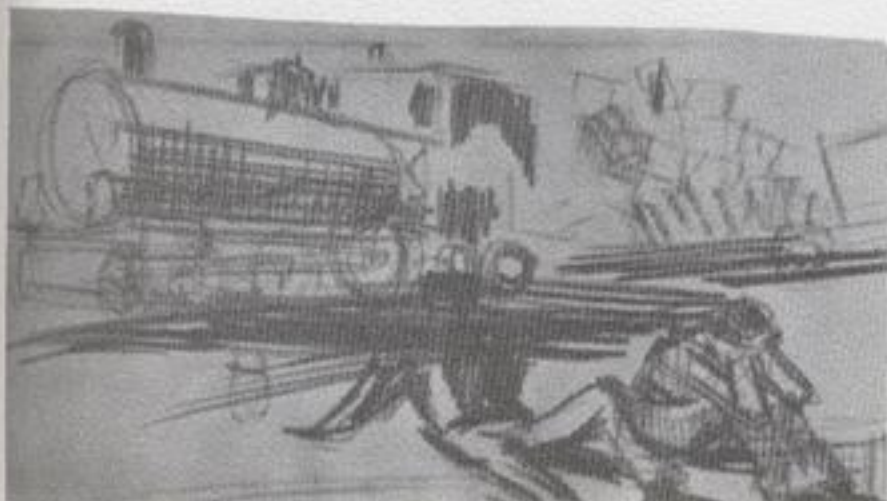
THE OUTSIDER

JUNIOR SOCCER

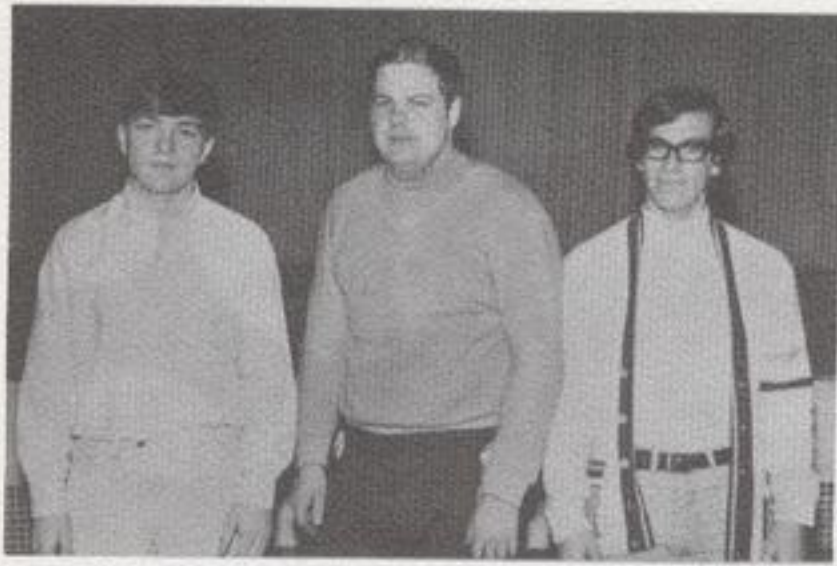
