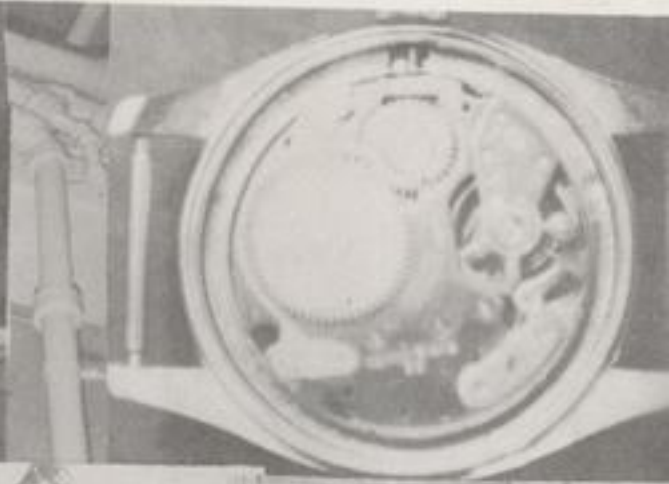
PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

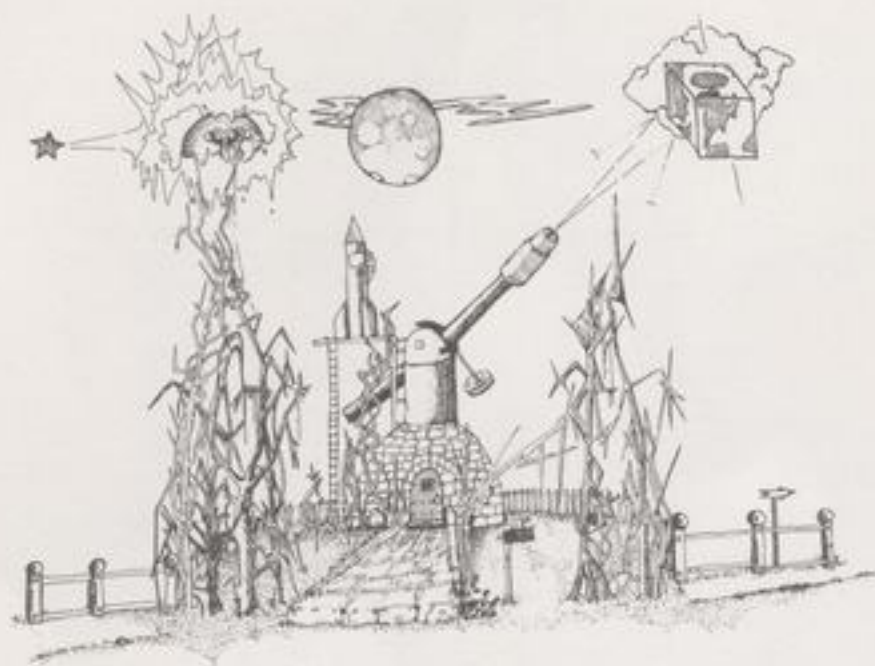

And the beaches they get all but wet

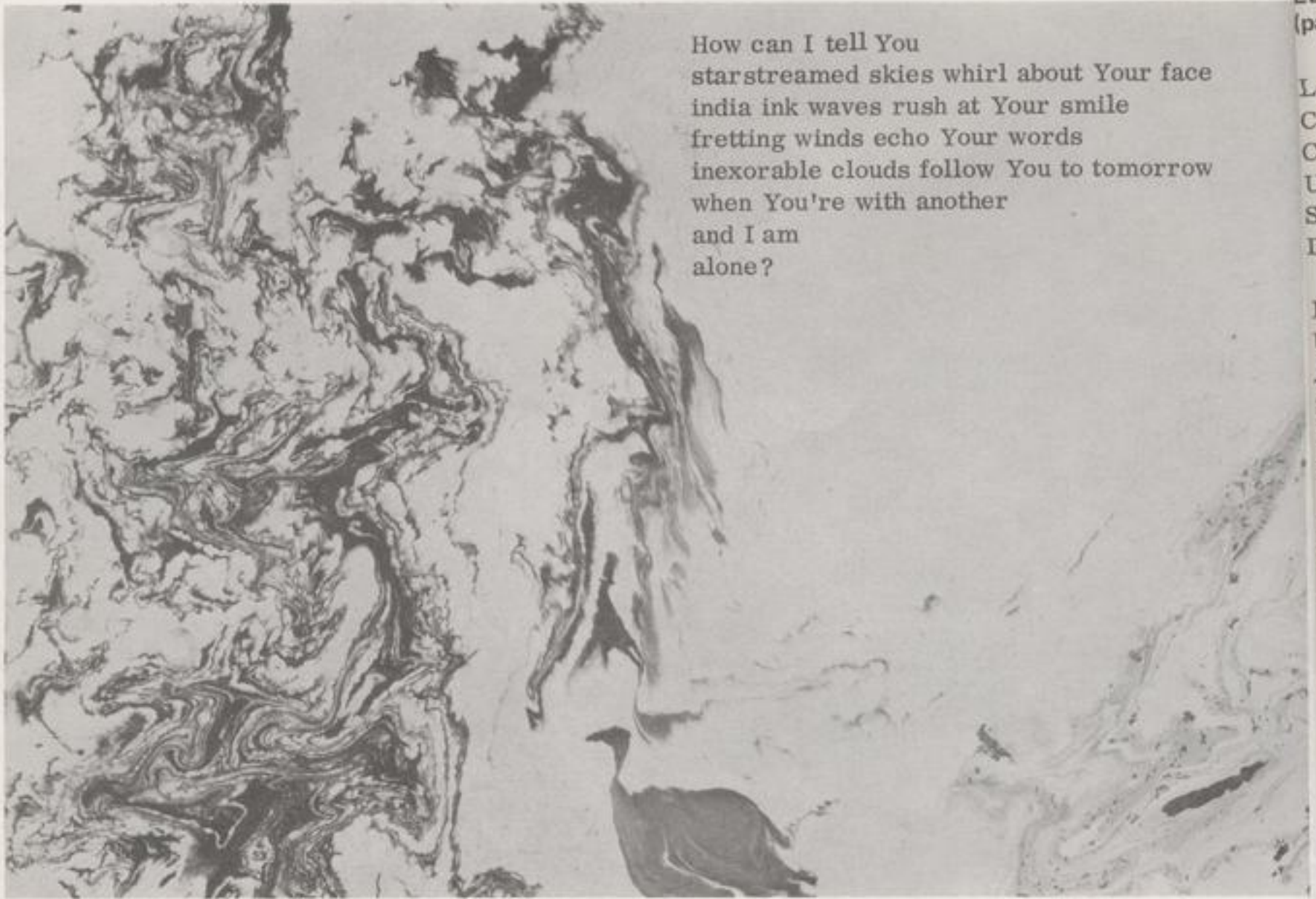
For a hundred years you sit and stare
