You, the members of the Class of 1952, are the last of many classes to graduate from West Hill at the high school leaving level. Your successors will work in, and graduate from, a new and very modern school.

I would not like you to think that you have been deprived of much that your younger friends, brothers and sisters will get. The building in which you receive your education is important but not nearly as important as the quality of the instruction and the traditions and achievements of the school.

You have had good instruction in the classroom and this school in its past has set a high standard for you to follow in both the academic and athletic fields. West Hill has grown from a very small beginning in 1918 to become one of the large high schools of the city in the 30's, 40's and the 50's. The graduating class of 1919 consisted of two pupils, both girls. This year's graduating class numbers 236. From an isolated location in a gardening and farming community where the sidewalks were, for the most part, of the three-plank variety, West Hill now finds itself in a very large urban centre.

West Hill graduates are known and respected in all walks of life. They are to be found in all the professions and in business. They have brought honour to their old school through their academic achievement at the university, and through their ability in business. Many have become Rhodes scholars. In athletics, you have only to count the number of City Championships accredited to West Hill to realize that the record is good.

You of the class of 1952 have a great record to uphold. I hope your achievement will be equal to or better than that of your predecessors.

I wish you all the best of good fortune in the future. I hope you will make the most of the talent you have and that you will so discipline your lives that you will be valuable citizens of Canada. You will not find this easy. It will require courage and perseverance. The reward will not be entirely monetary but will rest in the inner satisfaction that you have lived to the best of your ability.

MR. G. H. HESLAM
A TRIBUTE

We are witnessing the end of a tradition that has ever sounded a note of pride in the name West Hill High School. That tradition has breathed life and spirit into old bricks and mortar.

Our tribute is less to the now elderly edifice that has housed us — students and staff — these many years than to the personalities who have made West Hill High School loved by her own sons and feared by her athletic enemies.

Of these personalities, to Mr. Gordon Heslam, Principal, we tender sincerest gratitude on the occasion of his taking over new duties as Rector of The High School of Montreal.

Without equivocation we can say he is no ordinary man. Graduating from McGill University in 1916, he had barely started upon his chosen career of teaching before he answered the call to the colours in World War I. He saw action in that fabulous 10th Battery, Canadian Garrison Artillery, whose personnel included other leading Canadians — Mr. Brooke Claxton, Mr. George Bourke, Mr. Arthur Irwin.

Mr. Heslam was wounded in action. After conclusion of hostilities he returned to The High School of Montreal, and in 1935 was appointed Vice-Rector. Seven years later he was called upon to undertake the responsibilities of Principal of West Hill High School at a time when Canada was engaged in a second world conflict. It was his genius that maintained efficient operation of this institution when war was making unending demands upon students and staff alike.

Mr. Heslam's Principalship saw the birth of the Scholarship Fund, the West Hill Home & School Association, the annual award of the Allan Hall Trophy. Not only the School, but the community too, owes a deep debt to him. He is Clerk of Session of Wesley United Church and a vigorous figure at the Montreal West Curling Club. The teachers acknowledge their debt to him as past president of the Provincial Association of Protestant Teachers, President of the Secondary School Principal's Association and Pension Commissioner.

Now he goes home again, as Rector of The High School of Montreal — "From strength to strength advancing; his soul well-knit and all his battles won". And we who go by other ways can but wish him luck, with more than a little sadness in our salutation.

"HOME THOUGHTS FROM ABROAD"

These days all thoughts of England seem to be centered on the Royal Family and the country's economic status. It is unfortunate that more people do not turn their attention to the Britons whom fifty Canadian girls now understand and admire.

Last summer I was lucky enough to travel with other members of Mr. Garfield Weston's Goodwill Tour to Great Britain. Over there I toured factories and towns and saw people of all walks of life at work and at their leisure. I talked to the man who shapes the famous Wedgewood pottery and to the girl who puts marshmallows in biscuits; shook hands with twenty Lord-Mayors and spent a weekend with fifty girls who arrived ten days later in Canada to see my country and its people.

One of the highlights of the trip was the day that Joan Black, of Winnipeg, and I spent with a family in Westmoreland, the beautiful lake country of England. To start the day we went to the little store in Near Sawrey, where Mrs. Gibson, our hostess, carefully laid out her ration coupons for the week's supply of tea, cheese, butter, sugar and sweets. A two-week ration of sweets, or candy, for a child amounts to about as many caramels or fruit drops in two large handfuls. Most English children would not know how to act could they go out every afternoon after school and buy two or three chocolate bars, as some of us do. For them, chocolate in any form, oranges, eggs, bacon and steak are rare treats.

After this rather revealing shopping expedition, Joan and I hardly dared eat the delicious roast of ham set before us at luncheon. After we had refused a second helping our hostess said, "It doesn't matter to us so much, we're used to food shortages. We've been looking forward to this occasion for weeks."

Yes, for weeks she had carefully saved enough coupons to give us what we were used to at home. As I left the table I could not help but think how kind, unselfish and generous the good woman was in spite of her meagre resources.

That afternoon we took a walk through the land that Wordsworth knew so well and from which he drew most of his poetic inspiration. Mrs. Gibson, who is a botanist, pointed out to us typical English flowers and shrubs.

We then visited the museum-home of Beatrix Potter, the author of "Jemimah Puddle-Duck" and other children's stories.

"Not a very exciting day," you'll say. Well, maybe not, but for me it was one full of meaning.

After a traditional four o'clock tea we parted with our friends, leaving behind us four Canadian chocolate bars and taking with us a golden memory of four wonderful people and an unforgettable day.
